## Round up of last week...

It definitely felt like the the start of the summer term last week with so much sunshine and lots of outdoor learning and playing.

The summer curriculum got underway with all of our KS1 and KS2 children beginning their new Geography units with some fieldwork. For KS1, ahead of diving into a study of The United Kingdom - our island home, the children took some time to learn how to use geographical vocabulary to guide others on a route. The children started by using compass directions to move their partner around a grid, before moving on to using a compass and a map to plan a route around the school. You can see our KS1 learners in action on pg 2.

Our LKS2 Geographers will be looking beyond the United Kingdom as they take a closer look at the continent of Europe, but first, they have taken some time to learn the difference between weather and climate. The children have measured the weather over the course of the week with a focus on the temperature (what a week to do that!) and cloud cover.

Over in UKS2, South America will be the focus of the Geographical study, but ahead of this, in fieldwork, children are learning the differences between commercial, residential and recreational land use. This involved taking a walk around the local area and identifying the different buildings on a basic sketch map before returning to create their own sketch maps including their findings as well as showing ordnance survey symbols.

In our assemblies last week, the children found out about VE day and why our country will be marking the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this event in the week to come. The children had a great sing along with Vera to We'll Meet Again
