



<u>Pear Class News - Autumn 1</u>

Welcome to the first Pear Class newsletter! I hope you have had a fantastic summer with your families and are ready for the new school year ahead. I would also like to offer a warm welcome to those families who are new to our school and will be enjoying their first school year here with us in Pear class. Despite the fact that it has been a different start for us all, one which I am sure you as parents have all been apprehensive about, the children have done amazingly well and have quickly settled into their new class. Although the mornings can be tricky for our children, as separation from parents has had to be prompt and independent, the children have shown true emotional resilience - they seem to be finding the separation easier than us parents! Life in Pear class is quickly settling and the children are forming friendships and gaining in confidence daily - it is wonderful to see.

We hope that you find the information detailed in this letter a useful guide to our day in school. If you haven't already done so, please take time looking at the Swansfield Park website, it is a great way of finding out information. More specifically, if you go on to Pear Class in 'class pages' you will find all the learning that has taken place over the past week. This is where we will share photos and captions of all the wonderful things we have been up to on a weekly basis. Read, Write, Inc

All children in Pear Class will begin Read Write Inc sessions the third week back at school. This will allow us enough time to get the children settled with a greater emphasis on emotional wellbeing as we feel that this is paramount considering what has been happening in the world this year and the toll this has taken on not only our children's educational developments, but more importantly their social interactions. With RWI, Pear class will begin the exciting journey of learning and using the letter sounds that will unlock the door to reading and writing. For RWI, Pear children are placed into two smaller groups and your child will be taught by either myself or Mrs Vicky.

Please support your child as much as you can by asking your child about the letter sounds they have been learning and practising these at home regularly. You will receive a RWI pack in the coming week which will detail the letter sounds your child is learning.

Mathematics

In Reception, mathematics will be taught mainly through practical activities and games with lots of opportunity for taking this learning outdoors. This half term, we shall be ensuring that everyone in Pear class has a solid understanding of numbers to 10. As well as counting forwards and backwards, ordering, reading and writing digits, we'll be comparing numbers by using clear mathematical language such as more, less, fewer, most and least. For children who master these skills within 10, we'll progress to larger numbers. In addition to this, we'll be learning 2d and 3d shape names, investigating the properties of these shapes and looking for them in the environment that surrounds us at school. Autumn and harvest produce will provide us with lots of opportunity to order and compare size.

The World

During this half term our main topics will be Myself, My World and Feeling Fine, Autumn and Harvest. The 'Myself' topic will be getting to know the children, especially their interests, it's a good opportunity for us to understand their likes and dislikes. Alongside this, we really want the children to enjoy coming to school and for them to be happy whilst they settle in to a new environment with new rules and routines.

Moving on from this, we will be exploring harvest, finding out about crops that are gathered in and learning harvest songs. This will lead nicely into a study of Autumn and we will use our senses to discover changes in the natural world around us.

During this half term, in everything we do, we will be teaching the essential personal, social and emotional skills needed to keep our classroom a happy and thriving place to spend our days.

Creative Work

Singing is a daily occurrence in Pear class and we'll be learning lots of new topic themed songs as well as enjoying old favourites! There will be opportunities for painting and collaging, particularly as we explore Autumn and Harvest. Of course, there will be plenty of creative materials out every day as part of our continuous provision and children will be free to follow their own interests and ideas.

Once we move away from our first topic 'Myself, My World and Feeling Fine' there will be more opportunities for our children to show off their creative side. Our next focus topic will be exploring Autumn and Harvest. Learning activities will include observational paintings, leaf dances, exploring hibernating and nocturnal animals and lastly storytelling with any of the autumnal avenues which the children wish to explore.

The Physical Stuff and The Outside Environment

Although for the time being we will not be participating in formal P.E lessons, there will be plenty of opportunities for Pear class to build up their gross motor skills. Pear class garden provides many avenues through which children will utilise their whole bodies; climbing and balancing across wooden planks on our tyres, digging in Autumn bulbs, regularly sweeping our extremely leafy garden and dancing, hula hooping, stilting and using up our abundance of energy! We will also be engaging in regular morning exercise through song and dance with yoga sessions in the afternoons. Dough disco, scissor work, collaging with autumnal objects, threading activities and model making will help to ensure that our fine motor skills get a bit of a work out too!

We go outside in all weathers and we have the appropriate suits for the children to wear, although a spare set of clothes or waterproofs is always appreciated (in case they do get wet or muddy). Every child in Pear Class MUST have a pair of wellies in school. These can stay in school in our welly box - stored in Pear Class corridor.

When the weather begins to turn cold, could you please ensure that your child has a coat, hat, scarf and preferably a pair of mittens rather than gloves. It is incredibly helpful to us if **all clothing**, shoes and wellies are named.

School360 Learning Journals

The online journal is our way of recording your child's development and journey from Nursery through to the end of their Reception year. It includes photographs and observations of significant moments during their time with us which link to the Early Years Curriculum that we follow. As we usually run drop in sessions to explain these journals and RWI in more detail, we will be thinking up a new way to relay this information to you so please bear with us.
