#### **Curiosity Care Courage**

Mrs Smith and Mrs Grimes have been so impressed with the children's contributions as we have explored these words in assembly. The children openly shared acts of care that have been shown to them by others in response to some fabulous pages from The Boy, The Fox, The Mole and The Horse. It was a special time as we reflected on small acts of care carried out instinctively by others which have had a lasting impact on us.

Together, we discovered that whilst we may never be called upon to display courage in the same way as the Ukrainian people are right now, we can be courageous everyday as we master something that we've been finding tricky for a while, take the first step to resolve a fall-out with a friend or choose the right thing to do when it's not

necessarily the easy thing to do!

We are lucky that our children at Swansfield love to be curious and take time and opportunity to discover more, investigate and ask questions each and every day!



The first spark came from Daisy in Maple Class who asked Mrs Smith and Mrs Grimes what we could do to help and our school response has grown from there. In Daisy's words,

"I wanted to help Ukraine because there is a war in it. So we've done fundraisers to help them get what they need. I'm very happy with how much we've raised from the cakes. We're planning on raising money as long as they need it." Our first fund raising effort was a bake sale which we held on a sunny March Friday afternoon.

We were blown away by the generosity of our school community and an amazing total of £1161.80 was raised.

Our children were not satisfied at stopping with this and their organisation continues. Children brought a sponsor form home just before the Easter holiday and we are looking forward to some 'golden silence' on Thursday 28th April. Staff think they are going to enjoy this so much it could become a weekly event! We hope the children have enjoyed gathering sponsors and we look forward to sharing a new total with you very soon.

Meanwhile, the children are still busy decorating their classrooms with Ukrainian colours and there are plans to extend this to blue and yellow hearts on the school fence and on classroom doors. With the warmer weather on its way after the holidays the school council has decided on sunflower planting to bathe the school in some yellow (hopefully set against blue skies) and an awareness raising fun run.
