Welcome to the Spring 1 Nursery Newsletter. I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all the new starters in Nursery and hope that everyone had a good Christmas break.

Classroom Organisation

With increased numbers in the mornings, Sandra will now be working with us during the morning sessions. We continue to have 6th form students as part of their placements throughout the week.

Recycled Materials

Thank you for all the junk materials that you have given us over the last term. Unfortunately I don't have huge amounts of storage space, so I will put a note on the board when we need more.

School Uniform

Nursery children are required to wear full school uniform. In particular, if wearing tights, they should be grey, as should trousers and skirts. All children should wear shoes (not boots), and they should be black. Ideally shoes should have Velcro fastening so that the children can fasten them themselves. Clearly, particularly with nursery children, accidents happen at the last minute — if that is the case please let us know. If you have any queries, the uniform policy is on the website, or I can give you a copy.

Start Time

I would like to remind all parents that the doors are open in the morning from 8.35 to 8.45 am. Please can you try and be in and out by 8.45 am so that we can shut the outside gate. This allows children going to the toilet or hanging jumpers on their pegs to do so in a safe and secure environment. If you arrive after 8.45 am please do so via the school reception.

If you have older children in school, after you drop off your child in Nursery, rather than walking through school, I have been asked to tell you to walk around the building and enter their classroom entrance. In the afternoon the doors open at 12.00 if you are having lunch and 12.30 pm for the start of the session. Please ensure you arrive promptly—again, the safety of the children is paramount and I am keen to minimise the number of times the door has to be opened. Additionally, Mary is on a tight schedule and cannot wait for stragglers for lunch.

Outside Environment

Our curriculum is such that we go outside in all weathers and we have the appropriate suits for the children to wear. Could you please ensure that your child has a hat, scarf and preferably a pair of mittens rather than gloves. It is incredibly helpful to us if all clothing (particularly jumpers/cardigans and shoes) are named!

The theme for Stay and Play this half-term is 'Numbers all around'. As with previous sessions, we will be inviting you in to spend some time playing with your children. Dates/times are:
