


It was pointing at the 5! What numbers are the other two arrows pointing at now?




Graphs like this are called **line graphs**. Line graphs are useful for showing information that is connected in some way, such as a change over time. Unlike bar graphs, line graphs allow us to estimate the values between points that are plotted.

Let's have a closer look at what graphs like this can show us...





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

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

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




