We were absolutely delighted with the unvalidated results which exceeded our targets and were significantly above the national average for the key measure of children reaching expected standards in reading, writing and maths.

This achievement is due to the hard work and dedication of a fabulous staff team who always go the extra mile to help the children and the support that you as parents give your children. However

last year there were several occasions when staff were not shown the respect that they deserve. These incidences significantly impact on our well-being and ability to do our best for your children. Our school continues to be an exciting environment which enthuses the children to learn; by working together we can help our children to achieve outstanding results. If you have a bit more time you can volunteer as a friend or a classroom helper - read on or see me for further information.


We look forward to seeing you at our events this term.

I'm sure that you'll be aware of the amazing Blue Planet 2 series and in particular the episode which highlighted the issue of plastic pollution and the impact that plastics are having on our oceans and wildlife. Last term we discussed this problem in assembly and considered how to avoid single use plastics.

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There has been a lot of publicity about changing food packaging and Morrison's have started to use



paper bags for fruit and vegetables. Last week a boat was launched on the River Thames which was made from recycled bottles. An aerial survey of Scotland has recently shown that remote parts of the coastline are covered in plastic waste.

For our family learning this term we want you to think about how you can help to reduce plastic pollution. What can you do to avoid using and disposing of plastics?

Please share your ideas creatively as a poster, newspaper article, poem or in any other form which helps to raise awareness. Most importantly let us try as a school community to reduce the amount of single use plastic in school.

Now that we have such an age range it is no longer possible to have a whole school assembly which is meaningful to all the children. Last year we split assemblies into infant and junior but still it was difficult to find interesting subjects to share until I came across

#### **Picture News.**

We have subscribed to Picture News and each week we will receive a newsletter about current affairs, a poster relating to an event in the news and suggested themes for both infant and junior assemblies and/or class enquiries. This approach will fit well with our new work on philosophy for children as it will provide topics for discussion. The outcome will be that we broaden the children's vocabulary and their ability to share their views, which will improve their reading comprehension skills and their written work..

I will let you know the news story that we will be focusing on in my weekly blog so that you can talk to your child about this as well.



We are working hard to get our 2017 – 18 performance data on to the website but here are the headlines. We have compared our results to last year's national averages as this year's national results are not yet available.

At the end of Early Years (reception) we assess pupils to see if they have achieved a good level of development. You can see that we continue to outperform the national average and 18% of our children achieved beyond the expected standard in all areas.

Our **Year 1** children did amazingly well and **96% achieved the phonics check** compared to a **national** pass rate of 81% in 2017.

In **Year 2**, our children completed their key stage 1 SATs and **exceeded the 2017 national averages** in all areas.

# Healthy School

As we work to maintain our Healthy School status please help us to keep our children healthy and safe by...

- Encouraging children to drink water. Please do not put juice or flavoured water into water bottles.
- Remembering to keep your child at home for 48 hours following sickness.
- Removing jewellery (except watches) in school. Children will be asked to remove earrings and nail varnish for health and safety reasons.
- Keeping dogs off the school site. Many children are frightened and dog fouling is a health risk.
- Walking to school or parking responsibly in the playground car park or on Prudhoe Street. Please remember that the staff car park is strictly out of bounds at all times.

- Respecting our neighbours. Please don't access the school site via the Police Station Houses.
- Keeping the gates closed to ensure that the site is safe at all times.
- Remembering that children will be learning in the outdoor environment - so please ensure that they have warm and waterproof clothing.
- Supervising your children in the yard before school and remember that football is not allowed at this time of day.
- Encouraging your child to eat school dinners or providing a healthy packed lunch in line with current nutritional quidelines.

All adults who walk unaccompanied through the school building must have a DBS clearance and have signed in at the office.

Please do not wander through the school building in the mornings. If you need help, go to the school office through the main entrance.
