Talking with our children about their learning and giving them regular opportunities to re-visit and explain what they know is really good practice and something that our children do often! Doing this helps our children to commit their learning to long term memory.

We also talk with children about aspects of the curriculum that they have particularly enjoyed and very often, the stand-out experiences are the enhancements that staff plan alongside their own teaching. These experiences include trips, residentials, sporting competitions, live theatre and music experiences and author visits just to name a few. A focus on Well-being



I'm delighted to let you know that at the end of last term, **Mr Nick Fordham-Scott** was appointed as our Children and Families worker here at Swansfield. Nick is a familiar face to many of you, having worked in school as a teaching assistant for a number of years. Nick is looking forward to building positive relationships with children across school to ensure that they are able to thrive. We know that family life can be busy, fast paced and often complicated and Nick will be available to support parents and carers too with a listening ear and a good knowledge of where and how additional services can be accessed when necessary. We'll be in touch soon with details of drop ins where you will be able to engage with other parents and carers and meet with Nick. In the meantime, Nick will be on the yard or the Avenue each morning so please do say hello!

As you know, we have used the Thrive approach for a number of years now. The aim of Thrive is to support wellbeing to improve attendance, behaviour and attainment. Many of our children across school have benefitted from Thrive support from one of our trained Thrive practitioners.

I'm delighted to let you

know that **Liz Tears** has been appointed as our Lead Thrive Practitioner and she will have dedicated time across the week to plan and deliver support for children who need it. Liz will be assisted by Claire Hornsby who will focus her work with our younger children and Nick Fordham-Scott who will practice the Thrive approach across school once he has completed his training.





Healthy School

As we work to maintain our Healthy School status please help us to keep our children healthy and safe by...

- Encouraging children to drink water. Please do not put juice or flavoured water into water bottles.
- Remembering to keep your child at home for 48 hours following sickness.
- Removing jewellery (except watches) in school. Children will be asked to remove earrings and nail varnish for health and safety reasons.
- Keeping dogs off the school site. Many children are frightened and dog fouling is a health risk.
- Walking to school or parking responsibly in the playground car park, on Prudhoe Street or Roxburgh Place car park.
 Please do not park on The Avenue.

- Respecting our neighbours. Please don't access the school site via the Police Station Houses.
- Remembering that children will be learning in the outdoor environment - so please ensure that they have warm and waterproof clothing and wellies.
- Encouraging your child to eat school dinners or providing a healthy packed lunch in line with current nutritional guidelines.
- Please do not use mobile phones on the school site.
- Remember that children must not use the climbing equipment before or after school as they will not be directly supervised.



Nut Free School

We have children in school with severe nut and sesame allergies. These allergies are serious and cause a rapid and life threatening reaction known as anaphylaxis.

Please be mindful of this if you are preparing packed lunches for your child and please avoid including any nut products.

Our school kitchen doesn't use nuts or sesame in the preparation of meals.
