Communication and Language

This week we are going to focus on **syllables**. **Syllables** are the sounds in words. Hearing syllables in words is a really important pre writing skill. When we spell we break down the word to hear the sounds. This is the same with syllables, it's the break down of words into individual sounds.

1. Now that you know a bit more about syllables can you clap or stomp the syllables in your families names?

2. Can you find 5 of your favourite toys around the house and clap the syllables? E.g. te-ddy, car, trac-tor, Le-go, di-no-saur.

3. Clap the syllables for the animal pictures attached.

<u>Maths</u>

This week our focus will be on one of my favourite number stories- **"I Spy Numbers" by** Jean Marzollo. This story is all about finding numbers everywhere in your environment. You can listen to me read the story first, but everyday we will focus on two different numbers. So, you will need to watch the story everyday and pause the book on different pages.


With this in mind.... Today we will focus on number 1 and number 2. So, listen to the first page of the story and press pause so your child can see the picture up close.. Talk to your child about the picture and what they can see. Can they find number 1 hidden in the picture? Remember, 1 is represented in different ways (1 colour, 1 egg, 1 spot on the domino, 1 stone in the avocado, 1 wheel barrow with 1 wheel, 1 single ticket that allows entry for 1 person). After lots of discussion, go and find things around your house that represent number 1 (keep your finds from each day as you will need them on Wednesday)..

Then, do the same for number 2. Think carefully about how number 2 is represented in the picture (2 holes in the scissors, 2 claws on the crab, 2 colours (pink and yellow) on the glasses, 2 hearts on the glasses, 2 arrows on the road sign and so much more). Then get searching around your house for number 2.

After your number hunt, practice writing the numbers 1 and 2. You can use the number rhymes on the right to help you form the numbers correctly.

Today's Physical challenge!


Today we are going to develop our fine motor skills with a tricky but fun activity!
