Illness

As most of you know, lots of children were off poorly before Christmas and the bugs have spread extremely quickly. Can I please remind parents that if your child is poorly, the best place for them is to be at home resting (so they can recover and no germs are passed on). If your child is sick, they should be off school for a minimum of 48 hours from when they were last sick.

Blog

Pick up/Drop off

If someone different is picking up or dropping off your child from school, please let us know by adding this change to our collection log (see a member of staff). If it is not in our collection log we cannot release your child from school.

Outside Environment

Our curriculum is such that we go outside in all weathers and we have the appropriate suits for the children to wear.

Now that the weather is getting colder, could you please ensure that your child has a pair of wellies, a hat, scarf and preferably a pair of mittens rather than gloves. It is incredibly helpful to us if all clothing and shoes (particularly cardigans, jumpers and shoes) are named!

Shared Learning 4

We would like to have a big focus on **numbers (counting, number recognition)** and **shape** this term and so we have decided to make some emphasis on this by creating a display.

Please bring in or send a picture of your child with a number that is important to them— for example their house number, or car number plate, or of shapes in the environment— for example a door (emphasis on the rectangle shape), car tyres (circle) etc.

Focus weeks

This term we will continue focus weeks. If your child did not receive a focus week before Christmas, keep a look out for your letter when we return.

FOR NEW STARTERS: The focus week is where Kerry and I closely follow your child's progress over one week and we will find a time to chat with you the following week about their progress made since starting. It is a great opportunity for you to ask any questions.

Learning Journals

Thank you so much for the increase in parental engagement with the learning journals. As a team we love to see the learning happening outside of the classroom, at home. Thank you! Please continue to add photographs and let me know if you have any problems with your journal.

FOR NEW STARTERS: As a way of recording your child's development and journey during their time in Early Years, we use online Learning Journals. They include photographs and observations of significant moments during their time with us which link to the Early Years Curriculum that we follow. We encourage any parent/carer contributions and would love you to add your own photographs of any learning that takes place at home. There will be prize draws for those parents that regularly add photographs to their journals. **In the next couple of weeks, you will receive your login details and instructions on how to access your child's journal.**

Secret reader

Don't forget to sign up (on the noticeboard) to be a secret reader! The children have LOVED listening to a range of stories being read to them by a range of parents/carers, grandparents and siblings.
