Introduction to the Primary Survey

In this lesson, we are going to learn about the Primary Survey.

The Primary Survey is a quick way to find out how to treat any life-threating conditions a casualty may have in order of importance.

Let's take a look at a character who can help us to remember the Primary Survey.

life-threatening conditions:

An illness or injury that could lead to death

DR ABC



D is for danger.

R is for response.

A is for airway.

B is for breathing.

C is for circulation..










DR ABC



Can you remember what each letter of **DR ABC** stands for?

Remember: These steps are in order of importance. For example, problems with the airway should be dealt with first, followed by problems with breathing, and so on. But if there is danger present which could injure you or the casualty, it should be dealt with first so that you don't become a casualty too!

- 1. Place your ear above their mouth and look down their body; look, listen and feel for normal breathing for up to ten seconds
- 2. You must make sure that the area is safe to approach.
- 3. Check that the casualty's airway is open and clear.
- 4. Check for signs of severe bleeding.
 - 5. Tell the casualty who you are and ask them questions to see if you can get a response.
