Story and Writing - The Very Hungry Caterpillar

Story with actions - Read the story and use actions so the children can join in.

The actions could be:

Very big and fat - move hands away from each other to show expansion.

Hungry and stomach ache - Rub tummy.

Caterpillar - Wiggle arms to look like a caterpillar.

For the numbers hold up the right amount of fingers.

Moon and Sun - Make a large circle in the air with your hands.

Ate - Pretend to bite into something.

But - Finger point downward (Pie Corbett action)

Butterfly - Flap arms like you are flying.

Activities for this Story:

Rewrite the main points of the story thinking about the stages of the caterpillar's life cycle.

Draw a story map thinking about the stages of the caterpillar's life cycle.

Keep a diary using Days of the Week for either you or the caterpillar.

Maths

We are following White Rose Home Learning Week 3 Use this week's learning as a recap of number bonds and fact families.

Activity 1

Can you show number bonds to 10 and 20 as a part whole model and a number sentence ($10 + 0 = 10$) We've done this before so use this as a recap activity.

Activity 2

Take a group of objects such as Lego (no more than 20) split them into two groups, can you represent what you have done as a part whole or a number sentence. Can you make addition and subtraction fact families with your objects?

Activity 3

Can you make number bond butterflies? You could do this by drawing an outline of a butterfly and putting a part of the number bond on each wing...be creative.

Activity 4

I know a lot of you are enjoying cooking so have a look at the Friday Challenge on White Rose and cook along or continue to do your own home baking and cooking, everything looks delicious.

Topic

This week we are looking at Life Cycles of plants and animals.

If you are planting and growing what stage in the cycle are your plants at? Can you draw the stages of a plants life cycle?

After reading the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar can you draw the four stages of a caterpillar's life cycle.

You could add labels to your pictures or do a piece of information writing about the life cycle using words like First, Next, Then and Finally.
