Mathematical Development

Let's keep thinking about teen numbers

Our Learning:

Recognising teen numbers and understanding that they are made with ten and some ones

1. Print the PDF sheet (don't forget you can pick a sheet up from the school office)
2. Remind your child of how teen numbers are made with ten and some ones.
3. Encourage your child to match the numbers in the ten frames with the digits. Try to encourage your child not to count all the dots each time. Identify where the ten is and then identify the teen number from the number of ones that can be seen. If there are four ones then the number must be 14.
4. For an extra challenge you can order numbers to 20 on the number track. This is optional!
