


Safer Internet Day 2024

The Internet can be used for many different things. It provides us with entertainment, allows us to communicate with others and can help us to learn new things.





What barriers might there be for having Internet access?


Making a Difference

Learn to spot fake news and avoid it.


Navigating Change Online


Think About It
