Now for today's challenge:

Today we are going to sort syllables. Using the worksheet attached, cut out and sort the words into the correct column. You can work out which column the pictures go into by clapping or stomping the syllables. If you don't have a printer you can sort some items from around the house into four categories- 1 syllable, 2 syllables, 3 syllables., 4 or more syllables.

Today we are continuing with our story, "I Spy Numbers" by Jean Marzollo. This time we are looking closely at number 3 and 4. Start by recapping the first two pages of the story and press pause after you have listened to page 3 and then 4.


First, lets look closely at number 3. Talk to your child about the picture and what they can see. Can they find number 3 hidden in the picture? Remember, 3 is represented in different ways (3 hearts on the dice, 3 holes in the spatula, 3 pans with 3 pan handles, 3 wheels on the trike, 3 striped colours on the rope and so much more).


After lots of discussion, go and find things around your house that represent number 3don't forget to keep your finds for tomorrow's activity...


Then, do the same for number 4. Think carefully about how number 4 is represented in the picture (4 strings on the guitar, 4 legs on the lizard, 4 prongs on the fork, 4 small stars on the flag and so much more). Then get searching around your house for number 4.

If you are enjoying this activity, feel free to move onto number 5 or 6 and progress through the book.

After your number hunt, practice writing the numbers 3 and 4. You can use the number rhymes on the right to help you form the numbers correctly.

Time for a fun afternoon of small world play! Get out your gritters from yesterday or any cars and trucks you have at home.

Get out the coloured pencils/pens and have fun drawing a map for your gritters to travel along. Why not set up a gritting station on your road map? You could use building blocks, Lego or any loose parts.
