Today is our last day of learning about syllables so lets have some fun!

Start by joining in with the "move your body" powerpoint and move your body to the syllables.

Our challenge today:

Use the Winter worksheet to circle the correct amount of syllables in each word. If you don't have a printer, you can just clap/stomp out the syllables and write down the answer on a piece of paper.



Maths

Today we are continuing with our story, "I Spy Numbers" by Jean Marzollo. This time we are looking closely at number 5.. Start by recapping the first four numbers and look back at all of the things you found around the house to represent each number.

Time to look at number 5. Talk to your child about the picture and what they can see. Can they find number 5 hidden in the picture? Remember, 5 is represented in different ways (5 colours on the rainbow, 5 peas in the pod, 5 sides on the pentagons, 5 points on the star, number 5 on the speedboat and so much more). After lots of discussion, go and find things around your house that represent number 5.

If you are enjoying this activity, feel free to move onto number 6, 7, 8 or 9.

After your number hunt, practice writing the number 5. You can use the number rhyme attached to help you form the numbers correctly.

Now that you have worked through numbers 1-5, I'd like to to lay out your items and talk about all your findings. Can you move any items into other categories? Do some objects fit into more than one number?

For example, the bird house on the right fits into number 2, 3 and 5. 2 holes on the front, 2 roofs, 3 holes on the side and 5 holes in total.

The teddy bear fits into number 1, 2 and 3.1 nose, 2 eyes, ears, hands and feet, 3 colours- brown pink and black.
