- 1. Time for phonics. Warm up with some speed sounds use one of the videos, or your own flashcards!
- 2. Today, we are introducing a new sound: 'oa' (goat in a boat). Watch the video, then open the ditty sheet and encourage your child to read it to you.
- 3. Now have a go at today's 'hold a sentence': look! A goat in a boat
- 4. Extension sentence: the toad and the goat like to eat toast

Maths - addition and subtraction within 20

Let's learn:

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This week we're going to continue to practise our addition and subtraction skills. Today we are looking at subtraction crossing 10. Watch the video then complete the worksheet (if you can't print it out, write your answers on a piece of paper or tell them to an adult).

Practical Maths:

Make a big number line from 0 to 20 on the floor - you could use chalk outside, or write numbers on pieces of paper indoors. Now, stand on a number greater than 10, roll a dice, and jump back down the number line that many jumps. Where did you start? What number did you roll? Where did you finish? Keep practising!













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


Ash Class Home Learning: Monday 1st March.

Topic - Geography: drawing a plan.

Imagine you are in an aeroplane, flying over Alnwick. Looking down, you can see the ground, the buildings, the roads, Alnwick Castle and even our school! This is called an aerial view. You could have a go on Google Maps or Google Earth to see what this looks like. Now, imagine you fly over a farm - what would it look like?

Task: draw a 'plan' layout of a farm. Label the different areas. You could colour it in - green for the fields with the animals in, brown for fields growing crops maybe? Have a look at the examples to give you some ideas.



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Physical challenge - Hunt the Hats!

Ask a family member to hide 10 of the same objects (hats, teddies, rolled up socks?) in the room. Can you find all 10 hats in 60 seconds? Each time you find an object you must take it back to the start before searching. Good luck!
