
We are mindful that some families may be struggling with available devices or can't access the internet – please send me a message if you are having difficulties – we may be able to help.

Ongoing contact is really important for us to ensure that everyone is well and therefore staff will be making welfare calls if we don't see regular online activity just to check that you are ok.



One of the most important jobs at the moment is to make sure that all our children entitled to free school meals have food.

We spoke to all our eligible families and listened to their circumstances. Although it would be much easier to buy vouchers for all children we heard that it was difficult either to get supermarket deliveries or get shopping with no one to look after the children and lots of families were self-isolating.

We therefore decided to make up a **food bag – well, two, to be precise!** **Hazel and the kitchen crew** prepare biscuits, fruit jellies, boiled eggs, cut blocks of cheese and wrap ham. Then it's off to Morrison's to pick up a weekly order of milk, fruit, vegetables, tins of beans and tuna plus a few other store cupboard essentials from our Community Champion, **Margaret Kerr**. **Mr Warburton, Ms Givens** and myself then pack the bags and leave them for collection or deliver around the area with drop offs as far afield as Amble and Embleton.


