



## Reception Home Learning



It's our last Read Write Inc of the week, time is whizzing! Remember, to tailor the RWI work to your child - a little bit of challenge is good but allow your child to experience lots of success. Here are the jobs:

1. Speed sounds - watch one of the sounds videos
2. Red words - do your own or watch one of the videos
3. Green words - watch one of the videos. Even if your child finds these hard, it's really good for them to hear the sound buttons being pressed and the words being blended together.
4. Read the ditty together. If your child finds this too hard, read it to them and get them to repeat after you or track the words with you as you read.
5. Have a go at writing some green words from our ditty: **put, top, hat**. Extension: **put on a top**  
**But** - if step 5 is too tricky, draw a picture to show what's going on in the ditty and try to hear and write the initial sounds of the key green words above.
6. Over the course of the week practice the letter formation on the PDF attached

### Mathematical Development

**Our Learning:** Understanding more than and less than. Finding a number that is 1 or 2 more or less than a given number

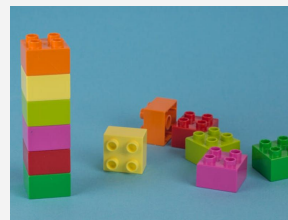
Let's have a practical session today! We've done a lot with paper and pens in our last two maths sessions. This activity is a game for two players!

1. Get out some wooden blocks or lego bricks - anything that you can stack. Give each player 10 blocks
2. Player 1 makes a tower and then instructs player two to build a tower that has more or less blocks. Check by putting the towers close together to see if player 2 has succeeded in the challenge.
3. Now, you can make the game harder by player 1 giving trickier instructions - make a tower that has two more blocks than my tower or make a tower that has one less blocks than my tower. You can make it even trickier with this sentence: I want the difference between our towers to be two (or three) blocks. That really gets the brain working!

### Topic

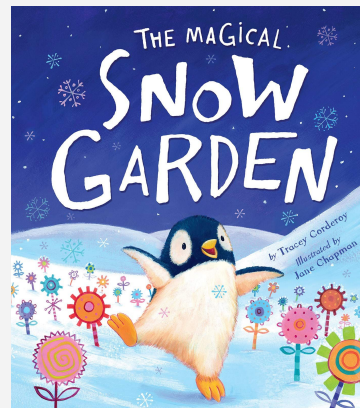
You might want to start by watching and listening to the story again.
