# Understanding the World

- Changes in the garden growth/decay
- Planting seeds, looking at different seeds
- Planting potatoes, carrots, sunflowers (healthy eating link for next half term focus)
- Talk about Spring flowers and different types of flowers/plants
- Talking about what animals we find in the garden (what they look like, where they live and why, what they eat)
- Recognising and naming mini beasts
- How can we look after mini beasts (making mini beast mansion)
- Watch Butterflies grow (looking at life cycle of a real mini beast)
- Learn about the life cycle of a frog

# Child-Led Topics and Activities

Other topics and activities may be used in response to children's interests. All adult-led topics may be adapted or removed depending on the responses of the children.

Core Mathematical and

Communication and Language skills will be central to all adult led activities and adult intervention within child initiated learning.

### Physical Development

- Doing exercise and noticing effects- cosmic yoga, dancing, running outside
- Practise fine motor skills threading leaves (mini beasts) with caterpillars, making spiders, sorting mini beasts
- Cutting along lines and round shapes- mini beasts
- Practice cycling, scooting
- Making tissue daffodils- scrunch/rip to develop fine motor skills

#### Mathematics

- Count resources, people, plant pots, garden tools, mini beasts
- Recognise numicon pieces
- Talking about height (vocab)
- Weight vocabulary- comparing weight of different toys/objects
- Size- Ordering plant pots/different mini beasts in size order (talking about the difference between vocabulary for "mini" and "mega" beast)
- Order irrelevance- knowing amounts of objects stay the same when changed order
- Mini beast sorting- "Has wings/has not got wings"

- Performance of stories/own stories
- Making mini beast mansion with varying materialstalking about which would be most suitable materials and why
- Colour mixing butterflies and self-service paint
- Making 3D mini beasts using junk modelling materials- Thinking creatively for a purpose
- Decorating pebble mini beasts
- Re-creating Van Gogh's Blossom tree (Spring link)
- Making Spring collages (based on artists)
