Communication and Language

Let's get our thinking caps on..... Start by having a go at the "find the rhyme" powerpoint attached.

Time for our rhyming challenges:

- 1. Using the Odd one out worksheet attached- All of the words rhyme except one... which one is the odd one out?
- 2. Grown ups- can you gather together some items/toys from around the house that rhyme (toy car and jar, pan and can, rice and dice, bag and flag) and ask your little one to find the ones that rhyme.

If you are feeling really clever, have a go at matching the rhymes on the "magic rhyme cards" attached.

Maths: Let's carry on sorting and looking for similarities and differences today!

Today's activity helps us to think about the vocabulary **same and different**. Today I would like you to gather lots of objects/toys that are the same but look different (e.g. lots of different coloured trains, different size cars, different looking dinosaurs, different looking dolls). Then together, look at what you've found and get your child to **explain how they are the same and how they are different**. Encourage your child to talk in sentences-"These trains are the same because they have 4 wheels" but "These trains are different because they are different colours".

Then talk to your child about how you could sort them. You could refer back to yesterday when you sorted in different ways (size, shape or colours). Or, think creatively and sort in unusual ways... you could sort animals into groups of wings and no wings, eyes and no eyes, live in the hot or live in the cold. You could sort food into healthy and unhealthy. Have a go!

If you're feeling really clever, have a go at the animal sorting worksheet attached!

Try and encourage your child to independently think of ways to sort.
