English - The Lorax by Dr Zeuss

Today, you are going to pretend that you are the Lorax and begin writing your letter to the Once-ler to complain about his actions. Keep going back to the story to help you in writing what you are angry about.

First, you need to write the name of the person you are writing to and then, on a new line, write an opening paragraph which tells the reader *why* you are writing. Remember, you are not happy with the Lorax so you need to be clear and show a 'strong voice' in your writing. You should include what the land was like before the Once-ler built his factory and how you feel now it has been completely destroyed. Attached below is a powerpoint for you to read through which gives examples of letter writing. Earlier slides help you write addresses at the top of your letter. You don't need to do this step but if you want to I have given made up addresses you could use or you can add your own twist! Slide 7 onwards guides you on writing a letter of complaint and slide 11 helps you in writing an opening paragraph. Also attached are word mats to help you in using a range of different sentence starters and in using powerful language. Lorax writing paper is attached if you want it but you might want to write on scrap paper at this point or type your work.

Tomorrow, we will begin to use your 'cause and effect' work to write the 'main body' of the letter.

In your opening paragraph, I would also like you to find an opportunity to use commas to list, You practised this earlier in the week. You could list a few things you are unhappy about. Remember to use the word 'and' before listing your last item.




Dear Mr Once-ler.
