English - Farmer Duck: Describe the setting

Listen to the story of "Farmer Duck". What a lazy farmer! It is such a good story though. Do you remember last week we found out that adjectives are describing words? See if you can use some fantastic adjectives to describe Farmer Duck's farm. Describe what each part of the farm is like; the barn, the house, the chicken coop and anywhere else you can think of. Try and use some fantastic adjectives like gloomy or dilapidated or any other fantastic adjectives you can think of.



Maths - Dividing by 2

Let's learn:

Today we are going to learn about dividing by 2. That's just splitting numbers in half. Watch the video and complete the worksheet.

Practical Maths:

Get 20 objects like pieces of pasta or sweets and some plates. Share them between 2 plates. How many is in each group? Try and halve each number from 1 up to 20. Which numbers can you halve and which can you not?






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Topic - Geography: drawing a plan.

Imagine you are in an aeroplane, flying over Alnwick. Looking down, you can see the ground, the buildings, the roads, Alnwick Castle and even our school! This is called an aerial view. You could have a go on Google Maps or Google Earth to see what this looks like. Now, imagine you fly over a farm - what would it look like?

Task: draw a 'plan' layout of a farm. Label the different areas. You could colour it in - green for the fields with the animals in, brown for fields growing crops maybe? Have a look at the examples to give you some ideas.

Ask a family member to hide 10 of the same objects (hats, teddies, rolled up socks?) in the room. Can you find all 10 hats in 60 seconds? Each time you find an object you must take it back to the start before searching. Good luck!
