


Oak Class Home Learning: Monday 22nd February

<u>Maths</u> - Division - share into equal groups

Let's learn:

When we share objects or numbers we call this division. Watch my video below to get the idea and have a go at the worksheet.

Practical Maths:

Get 12 objects like pieces of pasta or sweets and some plates. Share them between 2 plates. How many is in each group. Now try with 3, 4 and 6 plates. How many is in each group each time? Try with other amounts like 12, 15, 20 and so on.





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Topic - Down on the Farm!

Welcome back and welcome to a new topic all about farms. What do you know about farms already? Unfortunately we can't visit a farm, however, I have a few friends who are farmers and they're going to help me out a bit.

Task 1: look at the Powerpoint below. Can you guess the farm animal from the sounds?

Task 2: Then have a go at the worksheet matching the footprint with the animal.

Challenge: Find out which other animals you might find on a farm. Draw their footprints and see if you can find some information about them.
