You know the drill. Here are the jobs for today and remember to get in touch if you need any support or advice about Read Write |Inc work:

- 1. Speed sounds watch one of the sounds videos
- 2. Red words do your own or watch one of the videos
- 3. Green words watch one of the videos. Even if your child finds these hard, it's really good for them to hear the sound buttons being pressed and the words blended together.
- 4. Read the ditty together. If your child finds this too hard, read it to them and get them to repeat after you or track the words with you as you read.
- Have a go at writing some green words from our ditty: bash, leg, hug. Extension: dab the cut
 But if step 5 is too tricky, draw a picture to show what's going on in the ditty and try to hear and write the initial sounds of the key green words above.
- 6. Over the course of the week practise the letter formation on the PDF attached

Mathematical Development

Let's have some fun with our adding up! We love numberblocks in Reception!

So, today is our last number session before the half term holiday. We thought it would be fun to play this numberblocks addition game.
