Primary PE Funding 2015/16 EVALUATION



Under the Primary PE and Sport funding initiative, in 2015/16 we received \pounds 8595 to support PE and sport in our school. The impact of the funding must be considered in terms of:

- delivery of high quality PE lessons
- participation and success in competitive school sport
- a broader range of activities on offer
- personal health and well-being of pupils
- promoting pupil activity through involvement in organised games at breaks and lunchtime.
- improved attitudes and behaviour towards learning

We proposed to spend this money in the following ways:

Employing a specialised PE teacher to work alongside the PE subject leader to achieve the Sainsbury's Active Schools Kite mark.	£2800	Further work needed on competitive sports to achieve Active Sports mark, therefore specialised coaching in competitive sports across Key Stages is a priority.
Employing a local coach/mentor to provide 32 weekly urban sports sessions for a targeted group of KS2 children. Each session is proceeded with a group mentoring session to set individual targets.	£600	Weekly sessions delivered by a coach/mentor. Targeted children invited to join with some successful uptake. Age limit reduced to upper KS1 to encourage a higher turnout as not all targeted children took up a place.
		Next Steps: Access to Urban Sports Holiday Club only and payment for 5 places for targeted children to participate in sporting activities during each school holiday.
