# Read Write Inc

All children in Pear Class began Read Write Inc sessions this week. We begin the exciting journey of learning and using the letter sounds that will unlock the door to reading and writing.

Please support your child as much as you can by asking your child about the letter sounds they have been learning and practising these at home regularly.

You will receive a RWI pack in the coming week which will detail the letter sounds your child is learning. For RWI, Pear children are placed in small groups and your child will be taught by either myself, Mrs Pickard, Mrs Crowe or Mrs Vicky.

## Mathematics

In Reception, mathematics will be taught mainly through practical activities and games with lots of opportunity for taking this learning outdoors.

Key aspects that we will focus on this term are:

- Counting and matching objects to correct numerals.
- Counting backwards from 10.
- Counting on from a number.
- One more than
- Repeating patterns
- Measuring quantities and time

Please bring in Autumn treasures that you may find out and about!	Through P.E every Friday, gardening in our Pear Class garden and dance we will have many opportunities to get our heart rates racing and build upon our gross motor skills. Scissor work, collaging with Autumnal objects, threading activities and model making will help to ensure that our fine motor skills get a bit of a work out too.

**Every Friday** - Is P.E Day! We have begun our 'P.E' lessons on Friday mornings. It is essential that your child has a named P.E kit in school, at all times. Long hair must be tied back and off the child's face and all earrings **MUST** be removed, as stated in the Uniform Policy, a copy of this is available to you at the School Reception.

#### Requests & Reminders

Whilst the classroom door is always open in the morning for you to come in and settle your child, please ensure that you allow him/her to complete their morning challenge with a little bit of independence. Remember that for safety reasons, the classroom door must be shut by 8.45am. Please ensure that your child has his/her reading folder in school every day and make sure you are looking in there every night to ensure you don't miss any letters with key information on.

Please remember that only water is allowed in water bottles, your child needs to bring a water bottle every day. Please support your child by completing home learning tasks and by handing them in on time. Home Learning tasks will be set every Friday, and need to be returned by the following Friday.
