

# Coronavirus (COVID-19) Catch-Up Premium

Our school will receive a catch up premium grant from the government in the academic year 2020-2021.

The government recognises that children and young people across the country have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). Those from the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds are among those hardest hit. The aggregate impact of lost time in education is substantial and we need to ensure that children recover and get back on track. Returning to normal educational routines as quickly as possible is critical to our school recovery.

## Funding allocation

The funding allocation is calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil in years reception through to 6.

Our allocation is £25,600.

## Use of funds

We will use this funding for specific activities to support our pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months. Our plan is detailed below.

EEF Rationale			Pupils' access to technology has been an important factor affecting whether they can learn at home. As pupils return to schools, technology could also be valuable; for example, by facilitating access to online tuition or support.

EEF recommended Strategy			Supporting Parents and Carers
EEF Rationale			Parents have played a key role in supporting children to learn at home and it is essential that schools and families continue to work together as pupils return to school. Providing additional books and educational resources to families, with support and guidance, may also be helpful - for example, offering advice about effective strategies for reading with children.
